New update;

We are doing well. God continues to bless us. Both Debi and I have not been ill with anything for a while. I have not been beaten up, that is always good.

Last Sunday, we had two young men receive Christ. Both are in their mid twenties. One of the men owns a small shop. In his shop, he has been selling alcoholic drinks. He said that he is going to stop selling them now that he is saved. I have asked around and he was serious. He has stopped. What a blessing to see Christ changing lives.

Things are moving right along on our building. The foundation is now finished. We need to wait for about two weeks for it to sit and for us to make more bricks; then, we can start the building if I can get the rest of the money. I did not realize that the price to build goes up as you build. It seems like there is always some expense that was not calculated.

If you are able to help with the building fund we would greatly appreciate it. We are now about \$5000 short of what we need. I am praying that we can be finished with the building and able to use it before Debi and I leave on furlough.

Speaking of furlough, God has sent us another blessing. A missionary family that has been in Kenya for fifteen years has moved to Tanzania. They worked in the bush in Kenya so enjoy attending church in the bush. They asked if they could attend our church in Marurani. He has agreed to take over the music part of our service. As many of you know, I would not know a tune if it ran over me. For some reason, God decided that I did not need the ability to sing, so this is a huge blessing. I keep having the same experiences here as in the States. When I start singing, people start moving to the other end of the pew. I believe music is a very important part of worship and I am just not good at it; so, this will be a blessing to us all.

This couple has also agreed to watch over the work when we are on furlough. This has been a big concern for us. Our people have taken care of things for a short time when I was recovering from getting beaten and robbed, but, we do not know if they could handle seven months. Praise The Lord.

Speaking more about furlough, if you would like to have us report to your church sometime between October 2007 and May 2008, please let me know.

I was looking for lease vehicles for missionaries on furlough and found a place we can rent a van from at a very good price. This is an answer to prayer. So if you want us to report to your church, please send an email. We will have van and will travel.

Our children are doing well in the states. Tabitha is living in Tennessee and planning on opening her own daycare. Simon works in San Antonio, Texas installing computers.

Michelle lives in San Antonio. She is looking for a good job. So, please pray for her.

We had a scare early in the week. My sister called to say she had to take my Mom to the emergency room; she was having trouble breathing. God answered our prayers and she is doing OK.

We thank you so much for your support and prayers. We are so blessed to be able to represent you for Christ here in Tanzania.
